Meeting held @ 1169 S. Plymouth, 2nd Fl. at 6:30 pm *Present*: Lynda Young, Juli Valdez, Doug Freymann, Stephanie Daugherty, Pamela Focia; *Absent*: Wendy Ito (*phone check-in*).

1. ADMINISTRATIVE & MISCELLANEOUS

o Approval of the November meeting minutes distributed 11.23.10 - passed 4:0

2. BUDGET REVIEW

- o The budget proposal distributed on 1.1.11 was reviewed. Key issues included: (a) restructuring of budget categories to match the structure of the Charitable Organization Annual Report; (b) the impact of the Gravel Replacement project on the budget (see below). Following some minor changes, and the addition of a 'Targeted Donations' category to handle donations for particular projects (e.g. Gravel), the Budget was adopted by a vote of 5:0.
- The revised budget is included as an Attachment to these Minutes, and will be posted on the website.
- A proposal to terminate our relationship with credit card processor ProPay.com in favor of using the Square app provided for the iPhone by SquareUp.com was approved, 5:0. **Doug** will initiate the process of recovering to our account the \$1200 deposit + funds now held by ProPay.
- o It was noted that we need to clarify our insurance requirements for the year. If we hold no 'Events', do our costs go down? If we only participate in others' Events (but don't hold our own events) what will our costs be? These issues will be discussed when the policy is up for renewal later this year.
- The SLDogPAC needs to send out letters thanking various parties for their in-kind donations over the past year (e.g. Krisers', Christina the Groomer, Kinsella). Lynda will coordinate this with Wendy.

3. GRAVEL REPLACEMENT

- Stephanie reported on discussions with Mary Gawenda regarding the requirements to replace gravel at Grant Bark Park, and her contacts with vendors. An initial quote of \$419 for 20 tons of gravel delivered on site has been obtained. However, we do not yet know how much transport into the park, distribution of the gravel, & so on will cost.
- Lynda agreed to contact Frank Amato of the CPD about the process, permitting requirements, recommended contractors, and access for gravel delivery to Grant Bark Park.
- o In order to fund the gravel replacement project without blowing the budget, we will have to have a targeted donation drive ('Donate \$\$ so we can replace the Gravel!") to be initiated

real soon now and completed by May 1st. The goal is \$3000 collected. **Lynda** and **Stephanie** will coordinate this effort.

o **Stephanie** will check the status of the Seed Grant program in 2011, to see whether the proposal assembled in 2010 can be submitted.

4. NEIGHBORHOOD BAG DISPENSER PROJECT

There was agreement that initiation of a neighborhood bag dispenser project based on sponsorship of dispensers and bag supply should be a goal for 2011. It was noted that this kind of project needs to be thought through carefully, considering maintenance issues, security of the bag supply (i.e. not leaving it up to city bureaucracy), how to indicate sponsorship, obtaining aldermanic approval, and so on. We'll return to this in the next couple of months.

5. Maintenance

- Poo-free Parks Maintaining the parks in a poo-free state relies on Poo Fairies. It was suggested that we hire someone to periodically clean up the parks. **Doug** will follow up to obtain cost estimates.
- Park Shed We still need a lockable shed at Grant Bark Park. Pam will come up with proposals.

6. MEMBERSHIP CHANGES

- Proposal to eliminate 'benefits' of membership, such as the 'Supporter's party' as costing too much and being superfluous to the SLDogPAC project – approved 5:0. **Doug** will update the website to reflect the changes.
- Proposal to increase membership fees by \$5 (so \$20/\$40/\$80 basic/full/supporting) was not approved, by a vote of 2:3.
- The 2011 Membership Drive is to begin this month Pam will outline the process that we should take to remind existing members that membership renews on 3/31/11. Presumably, sending Fetch! out in January, February, and also sending out targeted emails to each member on the Mailchimp list thanking them for support, and providing a link to renew.

7. PARK BANNERS & SIGNAGE

- o **Stephanie** will follow up to arrange meetings two people who responded to the Columbus College listing for graphics support. [Note: both no longer available as of 1.17.11]
- o This project needs to move forward **Doug & Stephanie** will coordinate.

8. Outreach

- o Fetch/website blog outreach & surveys (see November 2010 notes) tabled for now
- o Donna's Café has indicated that they would like to coordinate about dog-friendliness at their new establishment. **Juli** will contact and discuss.
- o **Pam** will contact Katie Pape (?) a dog walker from the northside who is reaching out to the SLDogPAC.
- o It was suggested that if sufficient dogwalkers became business members that we could dedicate a website page to 'DogWalkers who support the SLDogPAC' or something like that. **Juli** and **Pam** will follow up with their respective dog walkers.

9. 16TH & WABASH DFA

- Pam & Juli reported on their meeting with Leslie Recht of the Alderman's office regarding the 16th & Wabash DFA proposal. Leslie agreed that they are to form the DFA support committee (independent of the SLDogPAC) to gather support and contribute to the design process. There has been no further confirmation or announcement from the Aldermans' office, however.
- o It was noted that some of the statements in the recent Chicago Journal article about the park (date: 12/15/10) were remarkably conflicted ('don't call it a dog park', 'the term DFA raises fewer hackles', etc), and should raise a huge red flag. It has also been noted that despite 1.1 acres being available for the project the favored 'large dog area' design in the new 'large' dog park is actually smaller than Grant Bark Park (0.4 acres).
- Pam has a number of contacts that want to join the committee, and will coordinate with Juli to come up with new ideas for the park and communicate them with the appropriate parties.
