Common Sense

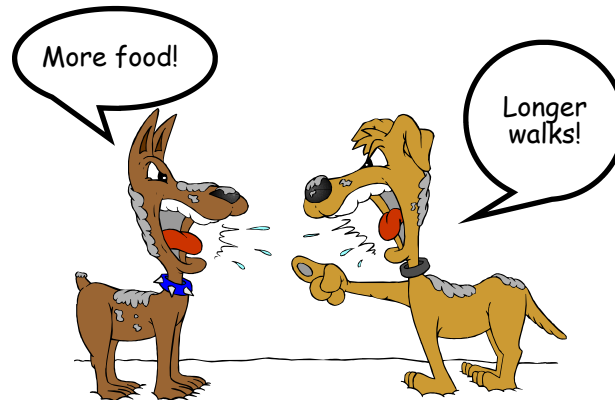


Scoop the poop
ALWAYS

Stream on the green

Try to discourage your dog from urinating on sidewalks, grates and buildings. Go the extra distance and bring your dog to a grassy area.

Hush the pup

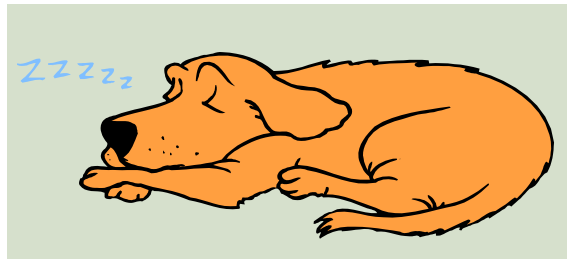
Try to discourage your dog's excessive barking; if you can't control your pet's barking, walk your dog away from the situation.

Poop is poop

Consider picking up that pile you come across which was left by someone else's pet and technically is not your responsibility.

Sssshhhhh they're sleeping

Be aware that parks are closed between 11 pm and sunrise. Respect these "quiet hours" for our South Loop neighbors who live next to parks.

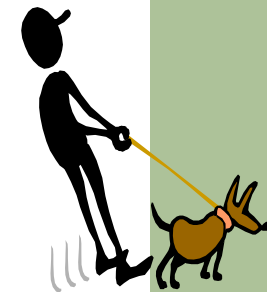


No dig, you dig?

Discourage your dog from digging holes so that the neighborhood doesn't look like a mine field.

Hang on to your dog

Be aware that there is a City ordinance which requires dogs to be leashed; tickets have been written for dogs off-leash.
